Enhanced Recovery Program has optimised the treatment journey for surgical cancer resection patients at St Vincent's Hospital, Melbourne. This program includes extensive pre-operative education and consistent protocolised evidenced based care from a multidisciplinary team. Notable outcomes are fewer post-operative complications and decreased length of stay for patients.

Emily has worked on a range of quality improvement initiatives within the unit, including the Enhanced Recovery Program. As a result of the success of this program, Emily has been awarded a scholarship to take part in the Victorian Comprehensive Cancer Centre Nurse-Led Research Post. Emily is currently working on a new initiative to provide safe, supportive, and effective care for our patients once thev cancer have completed cancer treatment and are discharged from hospital.
